TELEMATIC COMMUNICATION OF BIRTH TO THE CIVIL REGISTRY

- At this Hospital you may process the registration application, **from the moment of birth and** within 72 hours, (provided the birth is not included in the cases of exclusion).
- You must **MAKE AN APPOINTMENT**, by calling from the phone in the room where the mother has been admitted or from an external phone using the prefix 968.

You must turn up at the time of your appointment at the "TRAMITACIÓN DE NACIMIENTOS" [BIRTH REGISTRATION] office, located on the ground floor of the Maternity Hospital near the Centro de Programación [Programming Centre], with the following documentation:

- 1. Form for Declaration of Birth at the Civil Registry "Hoja amarilla" [yellow page] (This form is provided by the Hospital).
- 2. Document proving the ID of the parents (**ID card**, **NIE or Passport**) and, if applicable, of the declarant.
- 3. "Libro de Familia" [Family Book] or marriage certificate (where appropriate).

IMPORTANT NOTE: The abovementioned documents must be ORIGINAL and VALID.

CASES OF EXCLUSION.

In the following cases, the communication of the registration **CANNOT** be made from the Hospital and you will have to go personally to the corresponding Civil Registry office:

- When you have exceeded the legal limit of 72 hours from birth.
- If the mother has a previous marriage and it is necessary to rebut the husband's legal presumption of paternity.
- If any of the parents is a minor or has capacity judicially amended.
- In the case of non-marital children in the event of absence, death or incapacity of the father, mother or both parents.
- When both parents are foreigners of a different nationality.
- If the birth occurs outside the Hospital (in the ambulance, at home).
- If the mother has renounced her child.
- If registration is going to be made at any of the following Courts of Peace: Cehegín, Ceutí, Moratalla, Ojós or Ulea.
